My Voting Plan



Democracy and democratic values are on the ballot in 2022. This year's midterm election will determine control of the Senate and House of Representatives, which pass the laws that impact the day-to-day lives of everyday people.

But more than federal representation is on the line this election. Most states, cities, and towns also have state and local officials and ballot initiatives (also called ballot measures or propositions) on the ballot.

Local elections and ballot initiatives directly affect what goes on in our communities and represent a way for everyday people to vote directly on policies that impact them.

Use this guide to plan your vote on (or before) November 8th. The links included are from national organizations, but you can also visit your state's Secretary of State website for information.

If you haven't mailed your ballot by 11/5, check with your local election office to see if you can drop it off in person or at an official, secure dropbox to make sure it's received by the deadline.
