THE CHALLENGES FACING OUR DEMOCRACY

Today, the forces driving us apart and preventing long-term change are magnified even further by misinformation and a wealthy few who sow fear and division, undermining public discourse and our democracy.

Our communities and country lack the civic spaces and opportunities to hold brave, inclusive, and action-oriented dialogues between neighbors. Most public dialogue and decision-making processes fail to meaningfully include the individuals and communities most affected, and many communities face increasing barriers to participation.

65% of Americans say they always or often feel **exhausted of politics**

57% of young people aged 18-24 are **dissatisfied with American democracy**

79% of Americans **use negative words** to sum up their feelings on politics

84% of Americans say there is **more to be done** to achieve racial equality

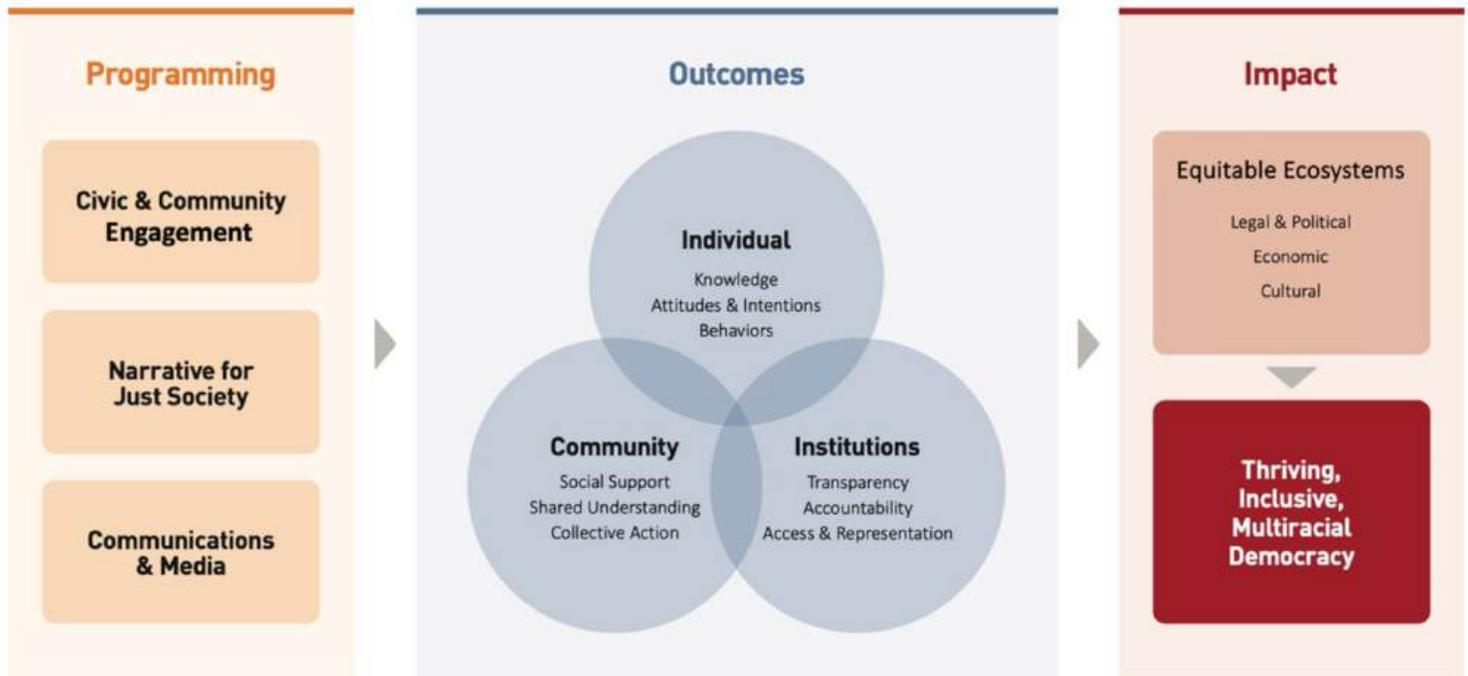
We base our dialogues in facts and amplify shared values so communities can come together for a common purpose. Our multipartial facilitation model **disrupts harmful practices** that "other" our neighbors, encourages perspective taking, and attends to the power imbalances that often occur in discussions.

Our work also invites participants to reflect on history, not only so that we can better understand today's culture and society, but to ensure we **make more inclusive choices for our shared future**.

OUR THEORY OF CHANGE



Our theory of change assumes that individuals, groups, and institutions are socially constructed and have reciprocal/interdependent influence on each other.

Our work changes individual beliefs, values, knowledge, and behaviors. Furthermore, our activities **create partnerships between communities and institutions** to achieve shared objectives, accountability, inclusion, and equitable civic engagement. In the long-term, we will see the impacts of our work leading to a more multiracial, equitable, interdependent democracy.

Each of our programs can be tested based on the components in the theory of change – individual, social, institutional, and civic change. Everyday Democracy’s Research and Evaluation department uses **multi-method and standardized measures to study processes and impacts** of different programs in both the short- and long-term.

DIALOGUE TO CHANGE

Dialogue to Change (D2C) is Everyday Democracy’s signature model to engage with community groups and for organizational capacity building. D2C is a three-phase approach (organizing, dialogue, and action planning) to creating sustainable solutions to local civic issues. The depth and quality of our interactive, inclusive dialogues focus on an exchange of ideas and a commitment to address systemic oppression.



2024: Revise D2C curriculum

2025: Hold D2C process in 1 community

2026: Run D2C processes in 2 communities

ACTION, CAPACITY BUILDING, & TRAINING

Action, Capacity Building, & Training (ACT) is a set of separate offerings, including leadership skills, dialogue facilitation, community organizing, and action planning.

2024: Pilot Everyday Leaders & multipartial facilitation training

2025: Provide training on 1 topic & develop 1 additional curriculum

2026: Provide training on 2 topics & develop 1 additional curriculum



CIVIC AMBASSADORS

Adult Civic Ambassadors provides training and skill building on organizing, leadership, and governance systems to promote equitable, local civic engagement and participation year-round. **Youth Civic Ambassadors** empowers and equips youth with the tools, skills, knowledge, and opportunities to become active, informed, and responsible civic leaders.

ARTS, CULTURE, & DEMOCRACY

Arts, Culture, & Democracy (ACD) utilizes the power of public art projects to share stories, make collective meaning, and co-create a more inclusive story of our democracy. It is a short-term, event-based approach to engaging community members with arts and cultural institutions around a selected focal topic.

DIALOGUE FOR TRUTH, RECKONING, & REPAIR

Dialogue for Truth, Reckoning, & Repair (TRR) is an in-depth, community-based longer-term approach utilizing truth-telling, empathy building, and acknowledgment of historical harms to heal, repair, and restore community connections.
